Our next meeting will be on Monday, June 19 At 1:30 pm on Zoom.

Of immediate importance is to decide on an Outreach Group or Project. Our last two were April---J1 Backpacks for bicycle and walking safety and in May, the White Hats which is the civilian rescue group so prominent in the last earthquakes in Syria and Turkey. In June we will collect for Homeless Prevention Council for the Backpack program in August which outfits kids for school needs in September. I think we could also collect school supplies. (I think Staples has a list.) I think we should continue in July and August. Looking for suggestions for Outreach recipients for those months and September. More suggestions are always welcome.

Now a proposal from me as the outgoing chair of Social Justice. The UUA Principles clearly show how important Social Justice is to our lives and work at UUMH Chatham. It defines our denomination and its mission, or if you like, our ministry to a large extent. Many of our members and friends are active in many organizations in our communities. (financial support counts) I would like to suggest that in place of a regularly meeting committee or working group, we call on our whole congregation to bring forth areas of interest or projects we can gather to work on. For me the asylum seekers (St Peter's Lutheran Church) and refugees is such an interest. Each of you has a least one that you feel a strong commitment to. I propose that a small group, 3 to 5 or 6, meet as a kind of steering committee.


SUMMER BLOOMS
