SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE

Social Justice will be co-chaired by Margaret Tompsett and Joan Caputo. The group is continuing its support of the group Grandmothers for Gun Safety which is very active in lobbying and demonstrating. Our affiliation with Nauset Interfaith Association will continue. Their task forces on Refugees and Homelessness

among teenagers on the Cape need our action and support.

We have chosen two Haitian relief groups for our September outreach. These donations will go directly to emergency earthquake relief.

Responding to Haitian Earthquake Victims From Rod MacDonald/Interfaith Justice Committee of the Federated Church and Am HaYam

These are the 2 organizations we are recommending: Both are extremely reputable, longstanding, Haiti-based and well-equipped to receive and distribute funds:

FOKAL - foundation committed to distributing funds directly to grassroots organizations based in the Southern region of Haiti, the area with the most severe damage.

Zanmi Lasante - Partners in Health, providing high quality emergency medical care.


ART ON THE HILL

SOLAR PANEL STATUS - AUGUST 2021

We continue to keep the solar project on hold. Both B&G and the Finance Committees think fundraising for the solar system is unwise while we are still working to pay for the AV system. We will work with Cape Cod Five Bank to see if our remarkable financial performance last year and our budgeted surplus for this year can improve the loan terms. If we can get the cost of the loan to be offset by electrical savings, we could consider the project without fundraising.

We are looking for a champion of the solar project. This person would analyze the funding options, lead the selection of a vendor, and oversee installation when we decide to proceed with the project. If you would like to champion this project, contact Joe Zahka at joseph.zahka@verizon.net.



AV SYSTEM UPGRADE FUNDRAISING

Thank you for your patience as we learn how to use the new AV system. The system is designed to provide quality content to both those on Zoom and in the pews. The components of the system are a camera that displays content from the sanctuary on Zoom, monitors that allow people in the pews to see recorded content and interact with those on Zoom, a "switcher" that allows smooth transition between components of the service, a control point in the balcony, and a modern sound board to control all the audio inputs in the sanctuary and Zoom. The sound board had been donated two years ago by two members of the Meeting House to support the summer concert series, but all the other equipment was purchased to make hybrid services work. We have only raised \$1,000 in fundraising for the system. \$8,000 from the Rogers' Building Fund and \$7,000 from the Reserve Fund have paid the remaining balance. We would like to replenish those funds so that we can consider other projects like solar panels and improve our balance sheet for the current year.

UUMH AV SYSTEM

This is a picture of the control system of our AV system. You can see the digital sound board, control monitor, ATEM TV switcher (under the monitor), and a laptop for controlling the system. In the distance, the two 75-inch sanctuary monitors are visible. Not seen are the camera mounted on the balcony railing and a second computer to monitor the service from Zoom. There are many buttons to push, but Worship Services provides the AV Tech with a script, so he/she/they know what is coming. The objectives of the system are to stream live content in sanctuary on Zoom, provide prerecorded content to the sanctuary, and allow members in the sanctuary and on Zoom to interact.
